At Saint Michael’s Conference, you won’t find cabins, mess halls, or archery. You *will* experience engaging conversations about Jesus, daily worship, and plenty of time to hang out with new friends.

Saint Michael’s Conference is a week-long summer conference that centers on worship, discussion, recreation, and relaxation, so young adults can seek a clearer vision of God in Christ.

What’s a day like?

We meet each morning to worship together and start the day in prayer. After a hearty breakfast, we spend time in an informal setting, learning and exchanging ideas about Christianity and the influence it has on society and each of us. Most afternoons, we’re playing volleyball, basketball, kickball, Frisbee, or lounging on the lawn.

Before dinner, we reconvene for Solemn Evensong. Evening activities range from square dancing and talent shows, to scavenger hunts and dance parties. Free time follows before lights out.

2025 COURSES

FIRST PERIOD

1st Year Conferees Forum: A study of basic aspects of Christian life including the Bible, the Eucharist, Penance, and Prayer.

2nd Year Conferees The Sacrament of Reconciliation: Getting right with God through self-examination, repentance, confession, and forgiveness.

3rd Year Conferees The Holy Eucharist: A study of the central act of worship, devotion, and sacramental life of the One, Holy, Catholic, and Apostolic Church.

4th Year Conferees and Beyond Liturgy and the Gospel: An exploration of how our liturgy is full of the truth of the Gospel beyond just the Gospel reading.

JUNIOR COURSE OPTIONS

A Junior is any Conferee who will be in grade 9, 10, or 11 in the fall.

Please select your top choice for each period.

Opening Your Bible: Let's be real—the Bible can seem daunting. We'll go through the basics so you can feel confident about how to engage with it.

Synopsis of the Gospels: We'll study the four accounts of the Gospel side by side and tackle hard questions about when they seem to contradict.

Hymnology: The hymn book is rich with Scripture references. We'll break down a few classics and some of your favorites to find both direct quotes from and allusions to Scripture passages.

Choir: In choir, we'll learn and rehearse the hymns and anthems that will be sung during Mass and Evensong.

Screwtape Letters: What can eavesdropping on demons teach us about living as a Christian? We'll survey this clever, funny, convicting book by C.S. Lewis to find out.

Friendship: Jesus called his disciples friends. What can we learn from how he defined "friendship"? What does it mean for our relationship with God and others?

A Senior is any Conferee who will be in grade 12 or above in the fall.

Please select your top choice for each period.

How to Lead a Bible Study: Part of maturing in your faith is knowing how to disciple others. We'll go through the basics of how to lead a Bible study.

Daniel: There's more to Daniel than surviving the lions' den. We'll explore how God worked in the life of this OT prophet.
